Subjects may be dropped only with the approval of the administration. Students who drop a course without permission will be dropped automatically from a second course and will receive a grade of "E" in each course. Students may drop a course during the first six weeks regardless of grade, but if he drops a course the last six weeks he will receive a grade of "E" if his work is failing at the time.

Students will be permitted to repeat subjects totaling not to exceed sixteen quarter hours on the two-year or four-year course.

A student's program is a sixteen-hour program, exclusive of physical education or a one-hour course. No change in program can be made without the approval of the administration. No credit can be allowed for work taken which does not appear on the program which must be on file in the office of the Registrar.

Students are requested to secure their post office box numbers and to call for their mail regularly. Please check your box number on the list posted in the Post Office and call for your mail at least ONCE EVERY DAY. If your name has not been spelled correctly, kindly report it to the Business Office. Two students have been assigned one box which means that each student must be careful to take only the mail addressed to him.
