A fee of one dollar will be charged students who fail to take an examination as scheduled.

Grades for the fall quarter will be held in the business office for students who have any of the following charges: Library fine, Textbooks not returned, Fees in the Business Office.

Students should inquire in the Textbook Library for lost books. Articles which have been lost may be claimed in the Business Office.

Courses not completed at their conclusion for reason approved by the administration will be recored as "Incomplete". Such "Incompletes" must be removed the next quarter of attendance. If not completed within the year, the incomplete is recorded as a failure. Students who received an incomplete in any subject must make arrangements for make-up work with the instructor before the close of the third week of the next quarter.

A fee of one dollar will be charged students who have not completed their registration by Nov. 29. Students will not be permitted to change their programs after Nov. 29. After that date a fee of one dollar will be charged to students who change their programs. No credit will be given for courses which are not on the program cards in the Registrar's office.

Students expecting to withdraw from college at the end of the fall quarter are requested to fill out clearance certificates. The graduates can obtain these blanks from Miss Lilleskov, and other students should call at the deans' offices for clearance forms.

Secretaries of college organizations should report the election of any new winter quarter officers. Please see that this information is in the student organization office this week.
