Division of Social Studies All majors who have been assigned student teaching should see their advisors at once to complete registration.

Students are requested to secure their post office box numbers tomorrow, September 10, and call for their mail regularly. Please check your box number on the list posted in the Post Office and call for your mail at least ONCE EVERY DAY. If your name has not been spelled correctly, kindly report it to the Business Office. Two students have been assigned one box which means that each student must be careful to take mail addressed only to him.

A student who finds it necessary to leave school before the close of the session should make arrangements with the Deans for an honorable dismissal. If it is impossible to do this before leaving, the student should write to the Deans as soon as possible explaining fully reasons for leaving.

A student program is a sixteen-hour program, exclusive of physical education or a one-hour course. No change in program can be made without the approval of the Administration. No credit can be allowed for work taken which does not appear on the program card which must be on file in the office of the Registrar.

Students should inquire in the Textbook Library for lost books. Articles which have been lost may be claimed in the Business Office.

Students are required to leave their addresses and telephone numbers at the telephone in the Business Office if they were not located when they registered. This is important because we frequently find it necessary to locate students when not attending classes.
